Pros

- ✓ An opportunity to have a break from studying and return refreshed. You can volunteer, get valuable work experience, and travel the world.
- ✓ A productive gap year can be valuable on your CV.
- ✓ You could relate the experience and activities to the subject area you plan to study.
- ✓ You can earn and save money towards your higher education costs or future plans.
- ✓ You will develop maturity if you don't yet feel ready for higher education or work life. For some careers, it can be an advantage to be slightly older and have some life experience.

Cons

- ✗ Some people find a year out becomes a distraction from their longer term plans.
- ✗ An unstructured year out may not add much value to your future – careful thought and planning are essential.
- ✗ It can be harder to return to study or work after a year-long break.
- ✗ It can be expensive and you could find yourself in a worse financial position at the end.
- ✗ If you don't get organised, you may end up spending your gap year just 'thinking about it'.






Completing your UCAS University Application



Student registers for a UCAS Hub account to carry out research and start an application.



Student completes all sections of the application and sends it to their school/college.



Teacher or Adviser reviews the application and adds reference and predicted grades.



Applications are sent to UCAS by the school of college on behalf of the student.



Universities and colleges make their decisions on the application.





All other applications:


6 PM 22nd October 2025

Compton Campus - All applications will need to be processed and sent before the christmas holiday, this is earlier than the UCAS external deadline due to transitioning into the new build

When can I apply?

- Advertised throughout the year; with no single application deadline.
- Larger organisations with multiple application processes may recruit earlier than smaller local organisations.
- Higher apprenticeships with a Sep/Oct start tend to recruit in the previous academic year.

How can I apply?

- Applications are made directly through the company or training provider.
- There is no limit on the number of applications you can make.
- The application process might vary across vacancies, you could be asked for:
 - CV and Covering Letter
 - Application Form
 - In App/Site application
